Introduction

This guide outlines the National Endoscopy Database (NED) trust admin and service lead roles.

NED is populated by data extracted automatically from the endoscopy reporting system (ERS) at endoscopy services in the UK. NED makes data available in user friendly outputs for clinicians, services and research purposes.

The aim of NED is to create an online database that collects data from all UK based endoscopy units to ensure high-quality service and facilitate large-scale audits as well as research. NED enhances JETS (JAG Endoscopy Training System), and its introduction means that trainees do not need to enter their data twice as NED can collect data directly from the ERS if it is NEDi2 compliant.

The key performance indicators (KPIs) in the NED dashboard are based on guidance from The British Society of Gastroenterology and are validated regularly. To see how the KPI's are calculated, please read the <u>NEDi2 KPI document</u>.

What can a NED trust admin do on the website?

A NED trust admin can:

- review and export KPIs for endoscopy procedures for sites within their organisation, as well as for specific endoscopists
- assess performance against national benchmarks for their organisation
- view activity metrics and demographics of procedures in their organisation
- view the NED upload queue to check status of uploads and errors (via JETS).

What can a service lead do on the website?

A service lead can:

- review and export KPIs for endoscopy procedures at the site they have the role at
- review KPIs for specific endoscopists at their site
- assess performance against national benchmarks for their site
- view activity metrics and demographics of procedures at their site.

Registering for NED

If you have previously used the JETS or JETS Workforce websites you will already have an account, so you do not need to create a new account. If you are unable to access your account, please contact us at askJAG@rcp.ac.uk.


Please do not create a new account if you know you have already used JETS or JETS Workforce. This can cause issues with your account in the future.

If you have never used JETS or JETS Workforce before and this is your first time using NED, you can set up a new account following the steps below:

- 1 Go to the NED website
- 2 Click the register button on the top-right of the screen.




- 3 Fill in your details.
 - > All fields must be completed to register.
 - > We recommend you use an email address that you will have continuous access to (eg a personal email address).
 - > Click continue after completing the CAPTCHA.



- > Your password must include:
 - o at least eight characters
 - o upper-case and lower-case letters
 - o at least one number
- > Add all of the sites where you work you can select multiple sites.





- 4 You will then be sent an automated email with your username to confirm that your registration is complete.
- 5 Your registration will automatically give you endoscopy access. If you require trust admin or service admin access, please contact askjag@rcp.ac.uk. This will require approval from the management team at your organisation.

Uploading to NED

Any sites that are using NEDi2.1 compliant software will automatically be uploading to NED and JETS. Once procedural information is entered into an endoscopy reporting system that is NEDi2.1 compliant, the data will be reflected on the <u>NED Pilot</u> and <u>JETS</u> websites on the following day.

A list of ERS suppliers and their compliance can be found on the <u>NED website</u>.

If you are working at a site that is not using NEDi2 compliant software, procedures will need to be added manually onto the JETS website and then will reflect on the <u>NED live</u> website after the overnight system refresh.




Using NED as a trust admin or service lead

For a comprehensive view of procedure data, we recommend using the <u>NED Pilot</u> website. This contains all NEDi1 uploads as well as NEDi2 and beyond. The NED live site may only contain NEDi2 uploads and manually entered procedures in JETS.

After logging into NED, please select the correct role on from the drop-down list. For trust access click 'NED trust admin' and for service access click 'service lead'.




To view the KPIs at your site or trust, please click on 'Data and KPIs' then 'KPIs.



Filters


The data on the homepage can be filtered by opening the filters box:




The information can be filtered by organisation, site, procedure type and date. With a trust admin role, you can select any site from your organisation. With a service lead role, you can only select the sites you have been assigned the role at.

The data is defaulted to show procedures performed by endoscopists as an independent endoscopist or trainee. If you require data from procedures completed as a trainer, you will need to filter this page by 'Independent and Trainer data'.





The data shown using these filters can be exported using the 'Export to Excel' button. This can be kept for your records.



You can also export this data into a JAG audit report template by pressing the 'JAG audit report' button.




The core KPIs tab is the first tab shown on the home screen. This shows the core KPIs for OGD, flexible sigmoidoscopy, colonoscopy, ERCP, EUS, and ENT at your trust or service.

The traffic light system compares performance against national benchmarks (where minimum standards or targets have been published).






All KPIs



More in depth KPIs for your trust/service can be seen by selecting the 'all KPIs' tab and choosing a procedure type. On this tab, you can search for a specific KPI for the procedure modality selected in the filter box.

The calculations for each KPI can be seen by clicking on the information button.



Endoscopists



The 'Endoscopists' tab shows the core KPI data for all endoscopists at your organisation or service. You can search for a specific endoscopist by using the search bar. The procedure type and date range for this data can be changed using the filters box.


To show all KPIs, tick the 'show all indicators' box:



If an 'Unregistered endoscopist' appears on this tab, this means that procedures have been uploaded to NED for an endoscopist who has not created an account. For this endoscopist's data to show under their name, they will need to register for NED using the same identifier (such as a GMC or NMC) input on the endoscopy reporting system.



Plot KPIs



The plot KPI tab generates a graph of a KPI selected in the 'KPI' dropdown menu. This graph shows the statistics from endoscopists at your unit or trust. An image of this graph can be exported using the 'Hi Res Image' button.



The activity tab shows information about the procedures completed at your trust/site. This can be filtered by one of the measures below:

- Admission type
- Biopsy
- Diagnosis
- Indications
- Therapies
- Urgency

It will also generate a pie chart to reflect this data below the table for each measure.



Demographics

The demographics tab shows the gender and age bands of the patients from your trust/service using the filters selected in the filter box. This data is reflected in a pie chart.

An age and gender distribution bar chart is also generated to show the range of demographics of the patients.

Discrepancies in data

Any discrepancies in data should first be attempted to be solved locally. You should review the data shown on your endoscopy reporting system (ERS) and resubmit any procedures which have errors or have failed to upload. The endoscopy or NED lead at your service should be able to help you do this, and you can also contact your ERS supplier for support.

If, after contacting your supplier, you are still experiencing data quality issues, please contact the NED team at askJAG@rcp.ac.uk.

Please note, only services that are NEDi2 compliant will be uploading automatically to NED. To check if your service is compliant, please contact your endoscopy lead.
